

Communication, language and literacy

Writing: The children will learn about the Great Fire of London through topic/history lessons. Labelling pictures from the GFOL, the children will create a word bank. They will be able to order the sequence of events and then write a recount of the events.

Reading: Children will continue to read Little Wandle reading books and will learn the difference between fiction and non-fiction through Science and Topic books.

Knowledge and Understanding of the World

History: Through the topic of the Great Fire of London the children will learn about significant event in history. They will order events of the GFOL. We will compare life from 1666 with now, using artefacts used during the GFOL. This will be explored through group work, observations, drama and writing.

Geography:

Using maps, Google Earth and atlases, the children will be able to locate and name the four countries of the United Kingdom.

RE: Friendship

Children will explore what it is to be a good friend and how to resolve disagreements using stories from Christianity, Hinduism and Buddhism.

Mathematical Development**Maths: Place value and Addition and subtraction within 20**

Count to and back within 20. Explore numbers 11-20. One more/less. Compare numbers. Recap number bonds to 10. Solve addition and subtraction problems up to 20. Solve missing number sentences.

Scientific Development

Science: Animals including Humans

The children will begin to identify animals and sort into groups based on characteristics. We will explore different diets and learn about carnivores, omnivores and herbivores. We will learn about our five senses and which parts of the human body are associated with these.

ICT: Coding

The children will learn how to code using simple programmes on Purple Mash.

Physical Development**PE: Attacking and Defending**

Through whole class and team games children will begin to learn the skills to attack and defend in ball games.

Circuit training

Children will begin to learn skills used in circuit training, following instructions, turn taking and helping others.

Personal, social and emotional development**PSHE: Diverse Britain**

The children will learn why we have rules and how they help us in our school and wider community. We will discover what it is like to live in Britain, exploring different cultures across the country. We will explore what similarities and difference we have with others.

Creative Development**Art: Exploring Colour**

The children will use primary colours to make secondary colours. They will explore painting and printing with mixed colours and then learn about Clarice Cliff; producing a final piece of art inspired by Clarice Cliff.

The children will learn the song "London's Burning". Using rhythm and "a round". They will add percussion.
