Topics: My World: Great Britain & Chinnor (Term 3 & 4), Oh we do like to be beside the seaside (Term 5 & 6)

My World (Great Britain & Chinnor)

National Curriculum Statements

- Locational and Place Knowledge:
 - Name, locate and identify characteristics of the 4 countries and capital cities of the UK and its surrounding areas

Knowledge and Understanding

Locational and Place Knowledge:

- What countries are in the UK? What are the capital cities of each of these countries?
- ➤ Where do I live in the UK?
- What changes are happening to the area I live in?

Human and Physical Geography:

- What are some of the key physical and human features of Chinnor?
- What is the difference between a village, town, city and country?
- How does Chinnor compare to London?

Geographical Skills and Fieldwork:

- Can you use a simple map of the local area and identify at least 3 features?
- Can you compare maps / photographs to describe how a place has changed over time?

Key Skills

Locational and Place Knowledge:

- Identify on a map, atlas, globe where countries the UK and countries are and name their capital cities.
- Describe and compare familiar places

Human and Physical Geography:

Describe at least 1 physical and 1 human feature of Chinnor and London.

Geographical Skills and Fieldwork:

- Ask simple questions e.g. What is it like to live in Chinnor? How does it compare to living in London?
- Can they draw a simple map / plan of part of local area / school?

Assessment Questions:

- Can children identify the countries in the UK?
- Are children able to identify the capital cities of the countries in the UK?
- > Can the children describe at least 1 physical and 1 human difference between Chinnor and London?
- Can they use a range of sources to identify differences in land use (e.g. photos, maps, pictures, etc.)?
- > Can the children describe one difference between a village, town, city and country?

 - What symbols are used on a map for Chinnor and what different ones are used for a seaside town?

Key Skills

- Human and Physical Geography:
 - ➤ Identify how each season is different
- Geographical Skills and Fieldwork
 - Use simple observational skills to study weather in area
 - Ask simple geographical questions e.g. what is a seaside town like? What would it be like to live there?

Assessment Questions

- Can children identify how the weather is different in each season?
- > Can the children describe at least 1 physical and 1 human difference between Chinnor and London?
- > Can they use a range of sources to identify differences in land use (e.g. photos, maps, digital maps, etc.)?
